P-EBT Benefits for 2021-22 School Year and Summer 2022

The New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) is issuing Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) food benefits for the 2021-22 school year and summer 2022.

Most schools have already reported required data to the state agencies, and most eligible children already rec qualified eceive free or reduced-price school meals. Children are eligible for a 2021-22 School Year

P-EBT food benefit if the school was operating with reduced in-person attendance, or the child was absent or remote due to COVID-19, during the 2021-22 school year. The benefit amount is based on the number of eligible absences/remote days in a month.

Automatic Benefit all eligible students of schools that provided daily attendance records with June 2022

enrollment information. Summer 2022 benefits for eligible students of schools that did not provide daily attendance will be paid by October 2023. Benefits were/will be paid on an existing SNAP EBT card, or a new or existing P-EBT food benefit card.
